Overall I think that this plan has been well thought through and I generally agree with it.

I believe this plan is correct in stating that the key factor is keeping the village as a village. It should be planned to look, feel and move at least as well as it currently does and we should not let excessive development beyond the real needs of the people clog up the village with too many cars or swamp the limited facilities that we have here. The village should retain a wide expanse of green fields surrounding it, keep low-rise housing in-keeping with its current look and feel, and have required developments planned sensitively such that the village is not turned into a mini town with every inch built on right up to a square perimeter. The green spaces should be allowed to penetrate in to the very heart of the village as they currently do. In such a small village, developments should be small and gradual to allow them, and the people moving into them, time to blend in and become a real part of the community. Previously developed sites, such as the area behind the British Legion, are ideal for re-using in the future and I strongly believe that developments near current traffic problem areas, such as the school, should be avoided.

This neighbourhood plan seems to consider all the key areas and have some good suggestions for the village's future.
