



Information Statement – Upper Broughton Neighbourhood Plan

On 5 December 2019, Rushcliffe Borough Council accepted the recommendations of the Independent Examiner for the Upper Broughton Neighbourhood Plan. This decision enables a referendum to take place for the Upper Broughton Neighbourhood Plan.

A neighbourhood planning referendum will be held for the Upper Broughton Neighbourhood Plan on **Thursday 30 January 2020**.

The question to be asked in the referendum will be:

“Do you want Rushcliffe Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Upper Broughton to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The referendum area and the area covered by the neighbourhood plan is the parish area of Upper Broughton, as shown on the attached plan.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if, on **Tuesday 14 January 2020**:

- He or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum Area; and
- His or her qualifying address for the election is in the referendum area. A persons qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is **£2383.35**

The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which the limit has been calculated is **362**.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
