I am writing to you regarding the St George's flags hanging on public lampposts and property in Gotham. Please could you let me know what the council is going to do about these as I am not sure why people can leave things up on public property, if this is the case people could hang anything they want on the lampposts, I am not sure why a St George's flag would be allowed, particularly given the current connotations?

Overnight there are now Union flags and St George Cross flags on every other lamp post leading out of the village. We all know why they have been put up but whoever put them there is clearly only thinking of their own views and not caring about anyone else's. Anyone driving through Gotham will think we all have the same racist views as those who put them up. If it is on their property then so be it but on the Highways property without permission surely isn't right. These really need taking down please.

I am writing to raise a serious concern regarding the large number of flags that have recently been tied to lamp posts throughout Gotham. These flags – primarily England and St George's Cross flags – appear to have been put up not as part of an official or community celebration, but instead by a group who appear to be promoting racist and exclusionary views.

While I fully respect that both the national flag and the St George's Cross are important cultural symbols, their widespread and unauthorised display in this context feels intimidating and divisive. For many residents, the sheer number of flags, combined with the motivations of the individuals behind them, creates an atmosphere that is unwelcoming and potentially threatening.

I would be grateful if the Parish Council and County Council could:

1. Confirm whether these flags have been authorised by the relevant authority.
2. Arrange for their removal if they have been placed without permission.
3. Consider putting in place clearer guidance and enforcement to prevent groups from using public infrastructure to promote divisive or extremist agendas.

The village should be a place where everyone feels safe and included. I hope that the Council will take this issue seriously and act promptly to restore that sense of safety and community.
