# Welcome...

...to the new quarterly newsletter from Rushcliffe Oaks – keeping you up to date and informed about our state-of-the-art crematorium facility that runs entirely on electricity.

Our aim is to keep everyone informed about our services and products, whether you are a colleague who visits us regularly or someone discovering us for the first time. As this is the first Rushcliffe Oaks Newsletter it includes a brief look back at the last few months since our opening as well as ongoing updates and news of an exciting event.

# What is Rushcliffe Oaks?

#### Rushcliffe Oaks is... the East Midlands' first electric crematorium

When we opened on 3rd April we were the fourth all-electric crematorium in the country, making us the 'cleanest and greenest' such facility in the East Midlands! During a cremation, our carbon emissions are reduced by up to 80% and our nitrous oxides emissions by around 50% compared to gas-fuelled cremators. We also have our own array of solar panels and a heat exchange system for the building's hot water, keeping us as energy efficient as possible.



Rushcliffe Oaks is... run by Rushcliffe Borough Council – and is also carbon neutral!

We are one of only 12 new publicly-owned crematoria to have opened in the last 10 years, compared to over 50 privately-owned operations in the same period. Rushcliffe Borough Council is talking the talk and walking the walk in their commitment to be carbon neutral by 2030, and Rushcliffe Oaks is honouring that commitment in providing an operationally carbon neutral crematorium for the benefit of the wider community. #### Rushcliffe Oaks is... flexible!

Within our Woodland Hall, everything is movable and *re*movable – even our catafalque! The standard arrangement provides seating for almost 120 in traditional straight rows, but a variety of alternative set-ups are also available. For a small number of mourners, the seating can be changed to a more intimate arrangement of just one or two semi-circular rows. This tends to work especially well for small family gatherings. For larger services, the glass partition between the hall and lobby can be retracted, creating one large space that will seat over 130 and accommodate over 200 in total. The lobby and the porte cochere have their own speaker systems, and a large additional screen in the lobby enables everyone to see and hear the service, wherever they are.

# What Has Happened Since We Opened?

#### Guided Tours!

It's been full on since March when we started our tours for funeral industry partners, giving everyone the opportunity to acquaint themselves with the Rushcliffe Oaks setup. We estimate around 200 colleagues came to see us on our initial open event, and it was great to hear the wonderful comments about how well designed the facility is.



We held our first services on Monday 3rd April, and over the seven months since it has been lovely to continue to receive positive feedback from family and friends who have attended services. We have also continued to welcome a constant flow of visitors to look around, and we are always amenable to requests from families, celebrants, and funeral directors to come and see what we have to offer.

### Our First Open Day

Our first official Open Day for the public was on Saturday 22nd July, when over 150 people braved the heavy rain to stop in and see us. Locally supplied cake and refreshments helped them to feel relaxed and welcomed, and as we showed people around there was great interest in understanding the process of what happens when a loved one is left in our care. Our team were kept very busy answering those frequently asked questions that so many people wonder about. There was particular interest from many visitors about our environmentally-friendly electric cremator.



#### Development of the Building & Grounds

Over time our plan is to continue enhancing the look and feel of the facilities here by adding more artwork to various spaces around the building, along with the installation of more features into our memorial grounds. For instance, new gravel beds have been installed into our Acorn Gardens formal lawn area, providing a better setting for the beauty of our Stone Orb memorials. In the developing Quercus Woodland there are 8 more benches to be installed, along with three more carved wooden animals – squirrel, fox, and rabbit – to complement the existing hedgehog, badger and owl which are already in place.

As the physical site continues to mature, our digital site will continue to be updated with the most upto-date imagery, including in the downloadable versions of our publications. 


# News You Can Use!

#### TRIALLING A NEW SERVICE: Reduced-Price Attended Direct Cremations

This service is available at the reduced price of £475 and can be booked straight away, for a trial period. This period will depend on how successful the service is. Details of how it works are as follows:

• Bookings can only be made **no more than 5 working days in advance** of an available slot. This can be by calling our office or via our online Funeral Directors' portal, selecting the Direct Cremation option. For example, if booking for a Tuesday, the earliest this could be booked in would be the Wednesday before. Any bookings made before this will not be accepted.



- The entry and exit music for the booking will be selected by the crematorium.
- The family may also choose one additional piece of reflection music to listen to. This should be booked in through the Obitus system in the usual way.
- A free single halo photo can also be ordered for display.
- There will not be a speaker, such as a celebrant or family member.
- The only restriction on numbers attending is the capacity of our Ceremony Hall 120.
