

The current threat level for Nottinghamshire is SUBSTANTIAL.

Substantial indicates that an attack is likely.

likelihood of a terrorist attack:

- LOW an attack is highly unlikely
- MODERATE an attack is possible, but not likely
- SUBSTANTIAL an attack is likely
- SEVERE an attack is highly likely
- CRITICAL an attack is highly likely in the near future

Prevent Referrals:

Rushcliffe has the lowest number of prevent referrals in Nottinghamshire in the last 12 months

The highest number of referrals were received from Nottingham City.

Counter Terrorism Casework volumes have remained static since the last CTLP continuing to reflect a high tempo across the country.

Rushcliffe referrals relate to:

- Fascination with Extreme Violence or Mass Casualty Attacks (where no other ideology) & School Massacre.
- No Ideology - Other Susceptibility to Radicalisation Identified"
- However, Islamist Extremism and Extreme Right-Wing ideology remain the two greatest threats to Nottinghamshire and the UK.
- Emerging issues include the recently proscribed Palestine Action Group and the increased focus nationally and regionally on the UK anti-immigration grievance narratives.

Locally Identified Threats

The Nottinghamshire CTLP does not indicate any risks associated with Rushcliffe Borough Council area but identifies general priorities as indicated above in the referrals.

This risk assessment does not indicate any areas of additional concern and known threats are **low**.
