



BYELAWS AS TO EAR PIERCING

Rushcliffe Borough Council has made byelaws under Section 15(7) of The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, to regulate premises used for the above purpose.

The byelaws lay out conditions to which premises must comply and proprietors shall ensure that: -

- (a) All parts of the premises used by clients and operators are kept clean and in good repair.
- (b) All waste material arising from the treatment is placed in a suitable covered bin or leakproof liner bag. These shall be emptied at least once every working day or more frequently as necessary. Bins shall then be cleaned.
- (c) All furniture and fittings in the treatment areas are to be kept clean and in good repair.
- (d) A notice or notices reading "No Smoking" are prominently displayed within the treatment area.
- (e) Sufficient and safe gas points and/or electrical socket outlet enable compliance with these byelaws.

For the purposes of ensuring cleanliness and sterilisation of equipment used in connection with the treatment:-

- (a) An operator shall ensure that any needle, metal instrument and equipment used in treatment or for handling instruments and needles used in treatment, is in a sterile condition and kept sterilised until it is used.
- (b) The proprietor must provide equipment and facilities for the purpose of sterilisation and an adequate supply of hot and cold water readily available at all times on the premises.
- (c) Washing facilities must be available for the sole use of operators, with hot and cold water, sanitising soap and a nailbrush. Sanitary accommodation must also be available.
- (d) Any gown, wrap, or other protective clothing, or other such articles are clean and in good repair and have not been used in connection with another client unless it can be adequately cleaned.

An operator whilst giving treatment shall ensure that:-

- (a) His/her hands and nails are clean and nails kept short,
- (b) Clean clothing is worn,
- (c) Open wounds etc are covered by an impermeable dressing,
- (d) They do not smoke or consume food or drink.

NOTES - THE FOLLOWING DOES NOT FORM PART OF THE BYELAWS

Proprietors shall take all reasonable steps to ensure compliance with these byelaws by persons working on the premises.

A registered person shall cause to be prominently displayed on the premises a copy of these byelaws and a copy of any certificate of registration issued to him under Part VIII of the Act.

Any person who offends against these byelaws shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £400. If the convicted person is registered under Part VIII of the Act, the Court may, instead of or in addition to imposing a fine, order the suspension or cancellation of his registration, and of the registration of the premises in which the offence was committed if such premises are occupied by the person so convicted.

Nothing in these byelaws shall extend to the carrying on of the business of ear piercing as the case may be by or under the supervision of a person who is registered as a medical practitioner or to premises on which any such business is carried on by or under the supervision of such a person.



BYELAWS AS TO ELECTROLYSIS

Rushcliffe Borough Council has made byelaws under Section 15(7) of The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, to regulate premises used for the above purpose.

The byelaws lay out conditions to which premises must comply and proprietors shall ensure that:-

- (a) All parts of the premises used by clients and operators are kept clean and in good repair.
- (b) All waste material arising from the treatment is placed in a suitable covered bin or leakproof liner bag. These shall be emptied at least once every working day or more frequently as necessary. Bins shall then be cleaned.
- (c) All needles used in treatment are placed after use in separate covered and leakproof re-usable boxes, or disposable needle boxes designed for the purpose. Re-usable boxes shall be emptied at least once every working day or more frequently as necessary, boxes should then be sterilised. Where needle boxes are used they shall be disposed of safely at suitable intervals.
- (d) All furniture and fittings in the treatment areas are to be kept clean and in good repair.
- (e) All tables, couches and seats used by clients in the treatment area and any surface on which items of equipment are placed in connection with the treatment, have a smooth impervious surface, which is wiped down regularly with a suitable disinfectant.
- (f) Where tables and couches are used, they shall be covered by a disposable paper sheet, which shall be changed for each client.
- (g) A notice or notices reading "No Smoking" are prominently displayed within the treatment area.
- (h) Sufficient and safe gas points and/or electrical socket outlet enable compliance with these byelaws.

For the purposes of ensuring cleanliness and sterilisation of equipment used in connection with the treatment:-

- (a) An operator shall ensure that any needle, metal instrument and equipment used in treatment or for handling instruments and needles used in treatment, is in a sterile condition and kept sterilised until it is used.

BYELAWS AS TO TATTOOING

Rushcliffe Borough Council has made byelaws under Section 15(7) of The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, to regulate premises used for the above purpose.

The byelaws lay out conditions to which premises must comply and proprietors shall ensure that:-

- (a) All parts of the premises used by clients and operators are kept clean and in good repair.
- (b) All waste material arising from the treatment is placed in a suitable covered bin or leakproof liner bag. These shall be emptied at least once every working day or more frequently as necessary. Bins shall then be cleaned.
- (c) All needles used in treatment are placed after use in separate covered and leakproof re-usable boxes, or disposable needle boxes designed for the purpose. Re-usable boxes shall be emptied at least once every working day or more frequently as necessary, boxes should then be sterilised. Where needle boxes are used they shall be disposed of safely at suitable intervals.
- (d) All furniture and fittings in the treatment areas are to be kept clean and in good repair.
- (e) All tables, couches and seats used by clients in the treatment area and any surface on which items of equipment are placed in connection with the treatment, have a smooth impervious surface, which is wiped down regularly with a suitable disinfectant.
- (f) Where tables and couches are used, they shall be covered by a disposable paper sheet, which shall be changed for each client.
- (g) A notice or notices reading "No Smoking" are prominently displayed within the treatment area.
- (h) Sufficient and safe gas points and/or electrical socket outlet enable compliance with these byelaws.

For the purposes of ensuring cleanliness and sterilisation of equipment used in connection with the treatment:-

- (a) An operator shall ensure that any needle, metal instrument and equipment used in treatment or for handling instruments and needles used in treatment, is in a sterile condition and kept sterilised until it is used.
- (b) All dyes used for tattooing are bacteriologically clean and inert.
- (c) The containers used to hold the dyes for each customer are either disposed of at the end of each session of treatments, or are sterilised before re-use.
- (d) The proprietor must provide equipment and facilities for the purpose of sterilisation and an adequate supply of hot and cold water readily available at all times on the premises.
- (e) Washing facilities must be available for the sole use of operators, with hot and cold water, sanitising soap and a nailbrush. Sanitary accommodation must also be available.
- (f) Any gown, wrap, or other protective clothing, or other such articles are clean and in good repair and have not been used in connection with another client unless it can be adequately cleaned.

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An operator whilst giving treatment shall ensure that:-

- (a) His/her hands and nails are clean and nails kept short,
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Nothing in these byelaws shall extend to the carrying on of the business of tattooing as the case may be by or under the supervision of a person who is registered as a medical practitioner or to premises on which any such business is carried on by or under the supervision of such a person.
